Speech at Graduation Ceremony 2010/2011 of Macao Polytechnic Institute By Dr Fernando Chui Sai On, Chief Executive of Macao SAR 17 September 2011

The Government will also seek to provide better conditions for citizens to further their education, with a view to creating a life-long learning community with enhanced humane education and better competitive abilities that enables it to seize the new opportunities and meet the challenges of the times.

The SAR Government will continue to provide full support to the development of Macao Polytechnic Institute, and enable it to foster a quality labour force for the community.

On this occasion, I hope that you graduates will aim far and high, as you are the people who will shape Macao's future, and you are the epitome of its hope. You should avail yourselves of the opportunities that come with the strategic positioning of Macao as one of the world's "tourism and leisure centres". You should also bear in mind the missions of the times, and start from where you are and prepare yourselves for higher aspirations, in the spirit of life-long learning and moving ahead with the times, to better serve the community.
